Background and overview





Overview

- The Modern Cooking Facility for Africa (MCFA) was launched in November 2021
- Multi-donor programme established and managed by Nefco the Nordic Green Bank
- EUR 32 million initial funding from Sweden; European Union joined the Zambia country programme in 2022 with EUR 12.5 million












Project countries





Purpose

- Market creation: public sector funding to overcome early structural challenges in the market, incentivize scale-up needs of private companies and create conditions for longterm sustainability and commercial investment
- Accelerate access to modern energy cooking solutions to end-customers in the project countries





Objectives

- Contribute to SDG 7 affordable and clean energy
- Accelerate access to up to 840,000 modern energy cooking solutions to end-customers in the project countries provided with higher tier electric cookstoves and cookstoves that use sustainably produced solid and liquid biofuels or biogas solutions
- Support up to 25 private investees over 4-year implementation period
- Mobilise additional funding: target 1:1 leverage ratio
- Positive impacts on climate, deforestation, gender equality and health



MCFA Components

- Financial incentives for clean cooking services (CCS): "Soft"
 results-based financing approach MCFA financing deployed on
 grant-basis as "free-equity"
- Non-recoverable upfront grant up to 30%/50% depending on the Funding Window
- Technical assistance (TA) to CSPs:
 - tailor-made to each investee's needs, focused on business coaching and mentoring services
 - development and implementation of gender action plans
 - access to carbon finance

MCFA Calls for Proposals







First MCFA Call for Proposals (MCFA1)

- EUR 30.8 million offered in total in the initial six project countries, EUR 3.45 million in Mozambique
- Launched in April 2022 and concluded in February 2023
- 11 highest-ranking applicants shortlisted and invited to due diligence, two in Mozambique
- As of today, 7 contracts signed, 3 more will be signed in November-December 2023, 1 applicant undergoing due diligence

MCFA1 outcomes in Mozambique


- Funded by Sweden, expected contract value up to EUR 3.45 million in total
 - BURN Manufacturing Mozambique
 - Contracted in September 2023
 - Mozambique among the target countries for BURN's launch of new electric cooking product line
 - Will offer induction cookers and electric pressure cookers to 66,666 customers using PAYGO model in both urban and rural areas
 - Initial focus on Maputo and Matola
 - One more investee in contracting stage: will sell up to 2,000 biodigesters to customers in peri-urban and rural areas

Second MCFA Call for Proposals (MCFA2)

- To be launched on 29 November 2023
- Total available funding up to EUR 16 million made available under two funding windows:
 - Catalytic Funding Window: targeted at earlier stage companies with 50% of MCFA funding offered as catalytic grant
 - Scale-up Funding Window: similar to MCFA1, 30% catalytic grant
- Project countries: DRC, Kenya, Mozambique, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe + Malawi as new country
- Pre-Qualification stage will be open for applications 29 November 2023-31 January 2024. Applicants meeting basic eligibility criteria will be invited to submit full business plans. Shortlisting in June 2024.
